#### Who should attend the ISPD Summer Development School?

The first day – Tuesday, June 18, 2024 – is for Catholic elementary school principals and administrators. The next two days – June 19 and June 20 – are open to all Catholic school, parish, and (arch)diocesan leaders. Pastors, superintendents, associate superintendents, presidents, principals, advancement/development/stewardship directors, enrollment management/admissions directors, communication/marketing directors, board and council members, faculty/staff members, and any other Catholic leaders working in Operational Vitality.

#### Primarily, where do the attendees come from?

In the past, the ISPD Summer Development School attracted Catholic leaders from throughout the country. With this one being the celebration of our 35th anniversary, we anticipate excellent attendance. Usually 60% of the attendees come from the Greater New Orleans Area, and the other 40% come from different (arch)dioceses.

### How do I book my hotel information?

# It's my first trip to New Orleans...what should I know?

There is so much to do in New Orleans that it may be best to arrive the weekend before the conference or stay the weekend after. Here are some possibilities:

- Jackson Square/St. Louis Cathedral | stlouiscathedral.org
  The oldest active Catholic Cathedral in North America dates to 1727. This picturesque area is great for sightseeing, picnics, and entertainment.
- Café du Monde | cafedumonde.com
  Can you say beignets? The original café is just a few minutes north of the Hilton and is directly across from Jackson Square. It's a great place for breakfast and there's almost always a band playing outside. (There is also a Café Du Monde located inside the Riverwalk Outlets.)
- The Riverwalk Outlets Attached to the Hilton, the Riverwalk Outlets offers nearly 75 retailers from national chains to local stores.
- Frenchmen Street | neworleans.com/plan/streets/frenchmen-street
  Once a hidden gem among NOLA locals, Frenchman Street is now recognized as one of New Orleans' best spots for live music. Frenchman Street is a 30-minute walk from the Hilton and a 10-15-minute ride.
- Bourbon Street | neworleans.com/plan/streets/bourbon-street
   It's an experience worth the walk. About 15 minutes from the hotel, Bourbon Street is known for its bars and music.
- French Quarter | neworleans.com/plan/neighborhoods/french-quarter/
  While Bourbon Street is the most raucous part of the French Quarter, there is plenty to explore in the district. There are hundreds of small shops to explore. Known as the crown jewel of NOLA, you can fully immerse yourself in the Creole experience.
